



## Father Sam's Forum

**T**oday our RCIA catechumens and candidates will present themselves before Bishop Zubik at St. Paul Cathedral for what is known as the *Rite of Election*. In this ceremony, the bishop will acknowledge all those from around the diocese who are preparing for the Easter sacraments. The **catechumens** will now be known as the *Elect*, as they enter the final part of the journey to baptism, and the **candidates** are called to *continuing conversion* in these last weeks of their preparation.

For those of us already baptized, that call to continue on the path of conversion happens every Lent. As we listen to the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, we are drawn into the mystery of God's revelation to us. How does God show Himself? From my first course in theology so many years ago, the notion of *revelation* was foundational to understanding the relationship we have with God. God is revealed in a variety of ways to us throughout our lives. As Church we believe that the major source of revelation is Scripture and Tradition. All that has been handed down to us in the written word of God as well as in the teachings of the apostles and those early Fathers of the Church we consider the font of revelation.

Of course, we can see God revealed in the beauty of nature and in people and in all creation too. Jesus provided for us who would follow the call to discipleship by giving us the sources of revelation that allow us to ponder and treasure our identity in Christ as beloved daughters and sons of God. The only Son of God sacrificed for us is foreshadowed in the reading about Abraham's willingness to lose his son, Isaac. Human sacrifice was an acceptable part of cult worship in the time of Abraham, so the moral of the story comes when Isaac is saved from the knife, and we see that God does not want humans to offer one another. Yet, in Jesus, the perfect human was offered for our offenses.

The self-offering of Jesus provides a model for us. How can we be selfless and think first of others? What ways can we lay down our lives? The Letter to the Romans today has these wondrous words, *He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all*. Bishop Zubik's latest pastoral letter is about sharing. Christians give. It's that simple. We give because God gave first. Not only from our treasure but from our precious time and our gifts are we asked to share. Think about how and what you share this week as Lent continues to call us to conversion of heart and transformation of life.

**Holy Week** begins Sunday, April 5. Our principal Mass on Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) will be the 12:30pm. We are going to process from O'Brien Hall to the church as the liturgical instructions ask. Our ushers will direct worshipers to go to the hall for the introductory rites, and together we will "go to Jerusalem" like the crowds who welcomed Jesus into his own city. Those unable to ambulate may go directly to the church and find a seat, but all who can should join in the procession. The other Masses for Palm Sunday will begin with the solemn entrance. **N.B. There will be no 6:00pm Mass that Sunday.**

Why does the Church begin Lent with ashes?

### Lesson of the Week

How are Mass Intentions handled?

The universal law of the Roman Catholic Church in the **Code of Canon Law** includes these canons about Mass intentions:

#945 *In accordance with the approved custom of the Church, any priest who celebrates or concelebrates a Mass may accept an offering to apply the Mass for a specific intention.*

#951, #1 *A priest who celebrates a number of Masses on the same day may apply each Mass for the intention for which an offering was made, subject however to the rule that, apart from Christmas Day, he may retain for himself the offering for only one Mass; the others he is to transmit to purposes prescribed by the Ordinary.*

#953 *No one may accept more offerings for Masses to be celebrated by himself that he can discharge within a year.*

Another of the canons not quoted above makes it clear that Mass intentions are not “sold.” This is because it is *simony* to sell things we consider sacred such as the sacraments. While a parish may have a donation suggested for the Mass—in the Diocese of Pittsburgh it is \$10—those who cannot afford that donation are still able to request a Mass for their intentions and give what they can afford. Since we believe the Mass is the sacrifice of Jesus wherein we enter the mystery of his dying and rising, those who request an intention, like all the faithful who come to worship, join their own intention to that sacrifice. We cannot “buy” a Mass. This is important to understand because sometimes those requesting the Mass might wonder why an intention is not announced, or included for example, in the General Intercessions. While the intention of the priest is specified, each person who attends the celebration brings his or her own personal intention, so the offering is made for all those present, not only for the one providing the priest’s intention. We can’t say, “this is my mother’s Mass,” for example, since multiple intentions come from many worshippers. Better to say, “my mother is being remembered in a special way at this Mass.” In our diocese, the stipends from a priest’s second or third (on Sunday) Mass of the day are sent to our seminary for the formation of future priests. Also, as indicated above, a pastor has to carefully watch that a parish only take as many intentions as can be fulfilled by the clergy in one year’s time. That’s why we had to limit the number of intentions we could accept when the Mass Book was opened.
